## Aims of our Club (as per Constitution)

The objects of the club are:

- (i) To instruct and promote western riding and associated activities in the region.
- (ii) To provide facilities and equipment for members for western horse riding.
- (iii) To encourage people to ride and to learn to enjoy all kinds of activities connected with horses and western riding.
- (iv) To provide instruction in riding and horsemanship and to instil in members the proper care and humane treatment of their animals.
- (v) To promote the highest ideals of sportsmanship, citizenship and loyalty thereby cultivating strength of character and self discipline.
- (vi) To raise funds by all lawful means and to solicit, receive and enlist financial or other aids from individuals, trusts, companies, corporations, associations, societies, institutions, and other organizations or authorities and from Governments, Departments of State and public bodies, and to conduct fund raising programmes for Club or charitable purposes.
- (vii) To acquire and hold assets associated with or necessary to carry out the aims and objects of the club,
- (viii) Generally, to do all such acts, and to enter into and make such agreements as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the objects of the club.

## Information for Members

The Lazy W Quarterhorse and Western Riding Club is affiliated with the Horse Show Association of Australia (HSAA) and conducts its shows under HSAA rules. If an A show is conducted it is run under AQHA rules.

**New Event for 2010 – 2011** - Amateur Owner Paint Classes now have Champions for each sex.

### Led Classes/Amateur Owner

Where specified horses in led classes must be registered with the appropriate breed. You must provide a copy of your horse's registration papers secretary before you can enter registered breed events. Any other breed does not need to be registered and horses competing in these events cannot compete in the registered breeds section.

The same goes for Amateur Owner - a copy of your current Amateur Owner status must be presented to the secretary prior to competing in these classes. One has to apply to your breed for an Amateur Owner ticket eg AQHA, Paint Horse Aust. Other riders who do not have a registered horse can apply to HSAA for an Amateur Owner ticket provided they meet the criteria in the Rule Book. Copies of horses registration papers and amateur owner status can be email to the secretary at the latest 6pm on the Thursday before a show – [cbornholm@bigpond.com](mailto:cbornholm@bigpond.com)

**Weanlings** – must be at least 18 weeks old, before they are shown. Can't be shown before January 1<sup>st</sup>.

### Cruelty Rules

The Club has adopted and conducts all activities in accordance with the Cruelty Rules established by HSAA. These rules are listed in the constitution.

### Membership

Membership runs from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 31<sup>st</sup> August. Family \$35 (with one participating member – showing, riding), Family \$60 (with two to four participating members – showing, riding), extra participating family members add \$28 per person Single \$35, Youth \$35, Day \$15 (Novelty days – day membership \$10)  
One needs to be a full member to be eligible for Hi Point awards.

### Nominations

To be in to the secretary by 8.30am on the day of the show or 2.30pm (for twilight shows).

### Arena Levy

\$3 per rider per show (not per horse). Any children participating in led events are not required to pay an arena levy.

### Cancellation of Shows

Where the temperature at Port Augusta is predicted to be 38 degrees or higher for the day of the show on Weatherzone ([www.weatherzone.com.au](http://www.weatherzone.com.au)) the day prior to the show, then the show will be cancelled by 10am on the day prior. Eg If on Saturday the predicted temperature is 39 degrees for Sunday then the show will be cancelled 10 am on Saturday.

Twilight shows – if the temperature is predicted to be 40 degrees or higher then the show will be cancelled. If the temperature is in the high 30's the start will be delayed and will start with halter classes. We will decide by consensus on the day when the novelties will be run possibly after halter.

Cathy will email confirmation of cancellation the night before. People can ring Emily Byerlee or Cathy Bornholm for confirmation of cancellation. Generally rain will not stop a show, unless in flood proportions. Events may be modified to suit conditions.

### **Classes**

**Led/ Showmanship** – Western dress, must be registered for breed classes, except any other breed.

**Junior Horse** – Correct Western attire – horse may be ridden in snaffle, hackamore or Western bit. May be ridden two handed in snaffle or one handed with Western bit. Horse must be 5 years and under on August 1 (all horses turn a year older on this date regardless of when they are born.)

**Senior Horse** - Correct Western attire– horse must be ridden one handed in a Western bit. Senior Horses are 6 yrs & over

**Open** - open to any horse but the rules for senior and junior horse apply – western dress for western events, English gear for Hunter events – bridle must have a noseband, plain browband.

**Novice** – horse & rider combinations that have not won an Open, Youth, Junior Horse or Senior Horse class in that event (where there was more than one competitor) at Lazy W. If you start in novice you may finish the year in that class but if you win an Open, Youth, Junior Horse or Senior Horse class in that event (where there was more than one competitor) this horse and rider combination is no longer eligible for novice in that class the following year. Riders can ride in any saddle and bridle. Wear a long sleeved shirt, riding boots and western hat or helmet.

**Youth** – Correct Western attire and bit for age of horse – Youth without correct gear can compete in Novice classes. Youth is 18 years and under on August 1 2010. Helmet compulsory for novelties.

**Led Line and Mini Trail** – Western dress for led child (long sleeved shirt, jeans, western hat or helmet, boots)

Led Youth are not eligible for any other rider class except walk & jog.

**Led youth novelty** – any dress, boots and western hat or helmet(compulsory).

More than one led youth can ride a horse in this event but only the nominated rider for the horse will be eligible for points for the club and breed associations. This encourages children who may not have a horse to have a go and win a ribbon.

**Youth Novelty** – helmet compulsory

**Senior Rider** – for 19 years and over as at 1 August.

**Novelties** – any saddle or gear can be used as long as it is safe.

**2 Year Old horses** can not compete in ridden events until January. Can only compete in five ridden events. Two year olds may enter either a Two Year Old or Junior Horse class but not both.

**Fun walk & jog** – any gear, non point scoring – fun event

**Hunter in Hand** – Colour can complement horse, should be conservative. Eg long or shortsleeved collared shirt, preferably white. Vest, tie and gloves optional. Trousers should be loose enough to run in, jeans are forbidden. Running shoes or paddock boots are required.

**Ridden Hunter Classes – English gear** – jodphurs, short or long riding boots, shirt with tie or stock, helmet or bowler hat, English Riding coat, gloves optional but preferred. Optional – English spurs, hacking canes (not dressage whips or riding crops). All colours shall be acceptable, but preference should be given to traditional conservative colours.

English saddle and EFA snaffle, pelham, full or Spanish Snaffle bridle with cavesson noseband. No drop nosebands (except in Hunter Hack) or martingales or whips.

### **Correct Western Attire for Western Events**

Western saddle, correct bit and hands for age of horse, western spurs(optional), western style boots, western pants or dress jeans, western hat (Helmet optional). Full length chaps – shotgun or batwing(optional). Long sleeve western shirt, sleeves down. Tie, bandana or broach. Ladies dress blouse has a collar and buttons or zip down front or back and long sleeves. Body suits, skivvies and slinkys are acceptable. Long hair neatly pinned, tied or gathered up. Western cut jackets can be worn in season. Ladies may wear 1 piece equitation suits without chaps. Gloves (optional). Protective clothing eg vests, goosedowns, slicker or raincoat and hat cover may be worn in inclement weather. No martingales, nosebands or whips allowed.

### **Ages**

Horses – Junior horse – 5 years and under on 1 August, 2004

Senior horse – 6 years and over on 1 August, 2004

Riders - Youth – 18 years and under on 1 August, 2004

Senior – 19 years and over 1 August, 2004

### Registers of Merit

25 ribbons of one colour can be handed back to the club and the member will receive a large register of merit with Lazy W - Register Of Merit 25 (ROM 25) on it in recognition of their efforts. This also helps our club save money as we recycle ribbons to be used again (some ribbons are culled due to condition). Four Register of Merit 25s can be traded in for a Gold, Silver or Bronze Century (100 Ribbons) sash . If you wish you can hand your ribbons back in on show day and record them in the ribbon book and when you get to 25 you can collect a ROM 25.

### Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons

These can be returned to the club for either a sash, rug or voucher (eg Horseland) and certificate.

She designed it so that she could change the centre pieces of the rosettes to increase the numbers of champions etc won by Mikimak in the future.



You too could have a banner like this or similar design if you hand in 15 or more reserve or champion ribbons. This one was designed so that you could change the centre pieces of the rosettes to increase the numbers of champions etc won by the horse in the future. If you wished to hand in more than 15 we may negotiate a voucher as well.

You might like to have more than one horse listed on the banner.

You could also choose instead to receive a certificate and voucher (eg from Horseland or Bonnetts)

10 reserve or champion ribbons - \$20 voucher

20 reserve or champion ribbons - \$40 voucher

30 reserve or champion ribbons - \$60 voucher

40 reserve or champion ribbons - \$80 voucher

50 reserve or champion ribbons - \$100 voucher

### Trophies and Awards

Trophies and awards are presented at the end of the season. To be eligible for these you must be a full member (not day) and have competed in at least three shows per event to be eligible for points in that event for the end of the year awards. Halter points are counted on the horse only, no matter who the handler is, whereas other events horse and rider combinations are counted. Eg if you go in a trail event on one horse twice and twice on another horse, you wouldn't be eligible.

**Points Scoring.** If six or more in an event, 1<sup>st</sup> gets 6, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 5, and so on 6<sup>th</sup> gets 1. If three in an event 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1. One in an event gets 1 point.

### Horse Free Area

The mound areas are out of bounds for horses including near the canteen and secretary shed, western side.

### Ground rules

All manure to be cleaned up and put in designated area near loading ramp. Competitors to clean up and take their rubbish home with them. Blue plastic bins in shed not for use. Club has bin for collecting cans in canteen area.

### Approved safety helmets

These are optional for all riders in place of western hats. Youth must wear in novelty events.
